Evening Learning Centre for school dropouts and Out-of-School Children (from age 14 to 18 Years)

2. Objective (Need of the initiative or challenges faced before the implementation of the initiative)

To provide a Learning platform forschool dropouts and out-of-school children (from age 14 to 18 Years) in Gujarat to appear for the 10thStandard exam by setting up Evening Learning Centres (ELC) and enabling them to join the mainstream, under the framework of "Samagra Shiksha".

3. Coverage of the initiatives (Details of coverage of the targeted population eg. State, District, block, cluster, school, student, teacher, parents etc.)

05 (**five**) **Evening Learning Centres** (**ELC**), in Ahmedabad will be started as a pilot project under Samagra Shiksha — GCSE, Gujarat. These will give benefit to **450+ identified Students**. These centres will provide opportunities to school dropouts as well as failed students to mainstream in regular School & appear for the exams and further up-skill by undertaking vocational skill training.

4. Description of the Initiative including innovative aspects of the solution

According to the draft National Education Policy 2019, estimated 6.2 Cr. children of school age (between 6 and 18 years) were out of school in 2015. Also, around 3.26 Cr. youth between the age of (15-24 years) are non-literate (Last census). The state is trying to address the problem of huge number of adolescents between the ages of 14 to 18 years not being in the formal system of secondary education. Different programs have been initiated by government across the country to address this issue and help the school dropouts and failed students to appear for the 10th grade exam.

Under this program, Foundational Bridge Courses & Preparatory Training will be provided to the identified students to mainstream in regular schools & help them appear for 10^{th} Grade Exam.

6. Implementation details (Process followed for deployment/implementation)

A Non-Monitory MoU with an NGO working in the field of Education is done by Samagra Shiksha, Gujarat for implementation of this initiative. The NGO needs to identify Drop-out Students / OoSC from 14 to 18 age group & establish Evening Learning Centre in nearby Government Schools, where they provide Bridge Course to Identified students in evening time with help of experienced teachers.
